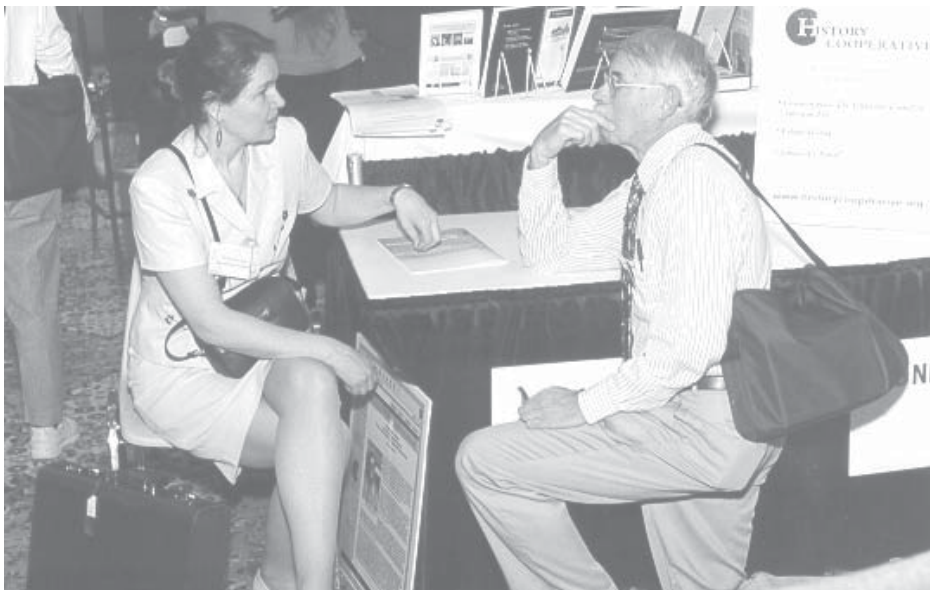

## Reservations

**1) Examine the floor plan** carefully before making your booth selection. Please include booth locations throughout the hall on your contract to ensure a booth of your choice.

**2) Fill out the contract completely** and return at least one original of the contract to Amy M. Stark, Convention Manager, Organization of American Historians, 112 North Bryan Avenue, Bloomington, Indiana 47408-4199.

**3) Postmark your application ON OR AFTER 30 September 2002.** This is to ensure that all companies, regardless of geographical location, have the same opportunity to receive their application before it must be returned to the OAH.

**4) Include payment of \$500** per booth reserved or proof that payment has been requested from your institution. Orders received without either of these will be held and processed when payment is received. Companies may send their contracts via overnight mail services as long as they are not sent prior to 30 September 2002 and the date of mailing is evident.

## Assignment of Space

Applications with a complete original contract and either payment or proof that payment has been requested will be processed based on the postmark date. Companies that exhibited at the 2002 OAH Annual Meeting will be given priority.

Booth assignment will not begin until 7 October 2002.

You will receive a confirmation of your reservation in approximately one week. Please feel free to email regarding your booth assignment after that date.

## Balance Due

Balance is due 15 February 2003. Reservations received after 15 December 2002 must be accompanied by full payment. Notification of cancellation must be made in writing. Cancellations received after 15 December 2002 obligate the exhibitor to full payment of the rental and forfeiture of all monies paid.
